#### Minimum wage rates for school based apprentices

School based apprentices are paid a minimum rate of \$16.98 per hour Monday to Friday between 6am and 6pm. This rate is based on the **first year** apprentice rate and includes a 25 per cent loading to compensate for off-the-job training. This loading is not a casual loading and school-based apprentices accrue pro-rata personal and annual leave based on actual hours worked.
