Return to Stage 3 restrictions for hot spots

Premier Daniel Andrews has advised a return to stage 3 stay at home restrictions will apply in the areas around Melbourne experiencing a rise in coronavirus infections from 11.59pm tomorrow night until at least 29 July. The restrictions apply to the following postcodes:

If you live in these areas, there will again only be four reasons to be out:

- Shopping for food and supplies;
- Care and caregiving;
- Exercise; and
- Study or work if you cannot work from home.

If you live outside of these locations there's only four reasons to come in: shopping for food and supplies, care and caregiving, exercise, and study or work – if you can't do it from home.

The businesses and facilities in these areas that have been able to recently reopen – from beauty parlours to gyms to libraries to swimming pools – will again be restricted. Cafes and restaurants will again only be open for take-away and delivery.

It's important to note **auto remains an essential service** and can remain open, the Premier has announced a further \$5,000 in dedicated support for a business previous eligible for the Business Support Fund Grant or a payroll tax refund.
