

Automotive Electric Vehicle Training - Stage 1 Commences in June

The Victorian Automotive Chamber of Commerce (VACC) is excited to advise members that enrolments will commence shortly in accredited Electric Vehicle (EV) training for June 2022 initially based at Chisholm Institute.

Technicians must be able to work on EVs without harming themselves or others and will undergo training in the unit **AURETH101 – Depower and reinitialise battery electric vehicles**.

This unit is mandatory before undertaking service and repair training and is perfect for all sectors of the automotive industry including;

- Repair & maintenance
- Towing operators
- Dismantlers of EVs.

VACC will work with Registered Training Providers (RTOs) throughout Victoria and Tasmania to expand delivery options, while continuing to ensure the training meets industry needs. VACC will be working with RTOs across Victoria & Tasmania to implement a staged approach to further EV training, as it becomes necessary for specific divisions of the industry (e.g., accident towing), to ensure that RTOs can build their capability and have the resources (vehicles, training material, teachers) to deliver high quality training.
