Holden, Opel and SAAB vehicles affected by Takata Airbag Recall

Members of the Victorian Automobile Dealers Association (VADA) and the VACC Used Car Traders Division (UCTD) are advised of a recent communication received by VACC and TACC from Holden Australia seeking industry support and assistance regarding the execution of the Takata airbag safety recall.

All VADA and UCTD members would know that manufactures with models that are fitted with affected Takata Airbags have been mandated to submit a 'second-hand vehicle action plan' to the ACCC which details how they intend to maximise the replacement of affected airbags in the second-hand vehicle market. Members are also reminded that they should not be subject to any expense derived from having affected Takata Airbag work completed.

VADA and UCTD members are advised that an element of the Holden plan is to reach out to LMCTs through as many channels as possible to ensure they are aware of the Holden impacted vehicles and recall initiation dates. Of particular importance VADA and UCTD members should be aware that Holden is responsible for Opel and SAAB vehicles affected by the Takata Airbag Recall.

Holden is also offering the LMCTs services that may assist them identify and rectify impacted vehicles within their stock.

With the recent launch of active Takata airbag recalls for model year 10-13 Holden Cruze, Barina and Trax vehicles LMCTs should be aware of their affected inventory and make arrangements to have this work completed.

VACC and TACC thank Holden for their initiative.
