Pandemic Declaration extended and updated Pandemic Orders issued

Following the recent [announcement](#) of the Victorian Premier's decision made under section 165AE of the *Public Health and Wellbeing Act 2008* to extend the Pandemic Declaration for three months, the Victorian Health Minister has overnight issued **updated Pandemic Orders**, operative from 11:59pm 12 April 2022 until **11:59pm 12 July 2022**.

For the automotive industry, there is no change to COVID-Safe requirements as a result of the updated Pandemic Orders, meaning previous requirements continue to apply in relation to:

- COVID-19 vaccination status
- COVIDSafe Plans
- Testing, Isolation and Notification, including 7-day close contact isolation
- Record keeping, including vaccination status of specified workers
- Signage
- Face masks, including the requirement to wear (unless an exemption applies) whilst working in an indoor space that is publicly accessible area of a retail premises or a food and drink premises

In addition, for members operating **food and drink** facilities:

- use of the Victorian Government's QR code check-in (for customers and workers)
- vaccination status checks (of customers)

As previously noted, **Authorised Officers are continuing random audits** on businesses throughout Victoria. Businesses who are unable to demonstrate their compliance (e.g. completed COVIDSafe Plan and/or vaccination status register of relevant employees, including working directors) for inspection on request, face an **on-the-spot fine** of up to **\$10,904** or up to **\$21,809** for serious offences.
