Fair Work Commission minimum wage increase

On 2 June 2023, the Fair Work Commission handed down its Annual Wage Review 2022-23 Decision (Decision), awarding increases to both the National Minimum Wage and minimum wage rates under modern awards (including the Vehicle Repair, Services and Retail Award 2020 (VRSR Award) and the Clerks Private Sector Award 2020).

TACC is disappointed that the balanced and responsible approach advocated by employer groups of a 3.5% increase has been ignored, with the Decision disregarding concerns over the inflationary impact and exacerbation of cost-ofliving pressures. Coupled with the 0.5% increase to the Superannuation Guarantee from 1 July 2023, the Decision is a significant impost for small business in particular.

Increase to modern award minimum wage rates

The Decision awards an increase to modern award minimum wages of 5.75%.

The 2023 wage increase applies from the first full pay period commencing on or after 1 July 2023.

As the wage increase will apply to minimum award rates of pay only, the minimum wage increase may be fully absorbed into any existing over-award rates of pay.

Proportionate increases will flow on to junior employees and employees to whom training arrangements apply (apprentices and trainees), employees with a disability and casual employees.

Increase to the National Minimum Wage

The Decision awards an effective 8.6% increase to the National Minimum Wage (NMW), which applies to employees not covered by a modern award or enterprise agreement. The increase is the result of the Decision ending the longstanding alignment between the NMW and the C14 modern award wage rate (raising it to the C13 rate) and then applying the 5.75% increase in line with the modern award minimum wage increase.

The NMW will increase as set out below and applies from the first full pay period commencing on or after 1 July 2023:

Current National Minimum Wage	New National Minimum Wage
\$21.38 per hour	\$23.23 per hour
\$812.60 per week	\$882.80 per week
